SIXTEEN residents of Rumah Sejahtera Sikamat near Seremban received a Chinese New Year treat when a team from Matrix Concepts Foundation visited them to celebrate the Year of the Rat.

Led by Datin Yong Chou Lian, foundation members started the

day by entertaining the residents with songs, dances and music.

Yong, who is the wife of Matrix Concepts Holdings Bhd group executive deputy chairman Datuk Lee Tian Hock, said such visits was an annual event for the foundation.

"As a caring corporate citizen, we need to inculcate the feeling of empathy and filial piety in our employees and one way of doing this is through such visits," she said.
