



Matrix + Melbourne = More to Come Management Team Visiting New Project Sites

2018 has been a fruitful year for Matrix Concepts, one of the renowned public listed property developers in Malaysia. Known for reaching remarkable and significant milestone achievements on Malaysian shores, the company debuted M.Carnegie in Melbourne, its first offshore development in Australia that was met with resounding success. While this flagship project has been impeccably completed, Matrix Concepts will undoubtedly continue to expand there. Two more projects in the pipeline will soon be in the limelight -- a house and land development in Greenvale, as well as the sought-after St Kilda's site with immeasurable potential to prosper. The management team of Matrix Concepts Malaysia has recently paid a visit to Melbourne to inspect the sites and meet with architects.

The completion of M.Carnegie has laid a substantial foundation to Matrix's future development in Melbourne. The 52 exquisitely designed and meticulously constructed apartments have attained 100% sold-out record. While Matrix Concepts understands the major concerns of investors is about return, all rental guaranteed units have also been seamlessly leased out within the first 60 days. It's unquestionably a win-win situation to all parties. While owners and tenants are content with the supreme living environment, the developer is ready to carry forward the success of M.Carnegie and expand to other districts in Melbourne.

In late November, the management team of Matrix Malaysia spent a few days in Melbourne to inspect the above-mentioned project sites, as well as connecting with architecture firms in planning ahead for these upcoming developments. Members from Malaysia included Mr Ho Kong Soon, Group Deputy Managing Director; Mr Leong Jee Van, Chief Executive Officer, Property Development; Mr Pak Heng Cheong, Deputy Head of Business, Development & Project Planning (Negeri Sembilan and Johor); Mr Louis Tan Say Kuan, Chief Financial Officer; and Ms Carmen Loo Kah Boon, Head of Group Corporate, Secretarial and Governance. The local Australian Project Development Director, Lee Jon Wee, and his team warmly welcomed them.

The management team first arrived at the project site in Greenvale, an up and coming western suburb only 10 minutes away from Tullamarine International Airport. As the name of the suburb suggests, Greenvale prides itself on its ample greenery and vale of nature. Matrix has recently acquired a 10-acre development site adjacent to the relaxing Greenvale Reservoir Park. Imagine owning a piece of land near the green and the water; life is not just about work and living, but also about enlightenment and enjoyment. Travelling to and from Melbourne CBD is also speedy and convenient. A mere 25-minute drive can transport residents to their workplace and the vibrancy of the city. Alternatively, residents can take a train from the nearby Roxburgh Park Train Station, which is only five minutes away from the site.

This 10-acre extensive piece of land will be divided into 64 landed residential lots, where different houses and land packages will be offered as an option. The whole project is slated to be launched in the second quarter of next year. The anticipated completion date is slated to be the end of 2020, where beautifully constructed houses will be handed over buyers. The GDV of this project (land sales only) is estimated to be about \$AUD 24,000,000 (MYR 72 million).

After scoping the land site in the Northern suburb, the management team headed towards the renowned St Kilda, an inner suburb of the metropolitan area only 6km away from the CBD and located at the southeastern part of Melbourne.

The focus of the team was on a building at 333 St Kilda Road, currently a backpacker hostel but will soon be rebuilt as a state-of-the-art avant-garde architecture. Situated in a prominent location with high visibility, the 2,540 square metre site proved to be of immeasurable development potential. To maximise its efficacy and in answering the needs of end-users, a study is underway to determine the best strategy and utilisation of the site, as well as the type and combination of development such a project should bring forth to prosper. The GDV for this project is estimated to be more than \$AU 80,000,000 (MYR 240 million).

While the visit to the two new sites implied forward looking prospects into the future, the inspection of M.Carnegie by the Malaysian management team entailed the celebration of a successful portfolio. As a debut project of Matrix Concepts Australia, the team was impressed by M.Carnegie's meticulously designed, constructed and decorated boutique apartments, and how it noticeably stands out among the rest in the neighbourhood. A masterpiece of living delivered and accomplished.

The verdict was neither made simply by a concise view nor a brief review. The team spent two nights living in M.Carnegie, experiencing the pride and satisfaction of the tenants. Each member has inspected and discussed the details of the building, both internally and externally, and could comment from their own experience -- as well as an end-user perception -- to contribute their opinions for improvements. The two nights' stay in M.Carnegie have enabled and inspired the management team in identifying better enhancement opportunities for future development projects.

The visit was made complete with the meeting of local architects and exploring some other local development sites, which equipped the team with a better understanding of the Melbourne property market. The Board of Directors meeting was also held on the last day of the visit, chaired by Dato Haslah Amin, Chairman of Matrix Concepts Holdings Berhad, together with Deputy Chairman Dato Lee Tian Hock, and the rest of the Australian and Malaysian management team.

If water be the elixir of life, then coffee is the fountain of youth.

While coffee is an acquired taste, its earned reputation holds the title as the second most valued commodity in the world following crude oil. Over the past 40 years, the coffee industry has mushroomed annually by 100 per cent, growing in market value to over USD100 billion. It is estimated that over 9.1 billion tonnes of the bitter beans will be traded in 2019, with Asia Pacific produced beans leading the export revenue, taking on Brazil as the dominator of coffee beans.

Just how did this innocuous and unsuspecting bean become so precious to civilisation? Nobody really knows and historians have traced it back to 15th century Yemen, where the elixir was romanticised in scrolls across monasteries before landing in Cairo and Mecca for a major makeover in its brewing methods. Curators have long believed that the super beans first made its appearance in the regions of Ethiopia, which is where the names 'Arabica' and 'Robusta' come from in description of the bean species.

While the chronicles of these elusive beans may be up for debate, its common name 'coffee' etymology is definitive. Due to its presumed origin, the Arabic word *qahwah* was adapted by the Ottoman Turkish empire into *kahve*. As the Arab-Persian empire expanded, the beans were introduced to the Dutch, who also borrowed from the phonetic to form the word *koffie*, which was later adapted by the English world and introduced in the mid-1600's as coffee. One world wind etymological trade later, the original word to mean dark in colour *qahwah* is today so beloved, every spoken language in the world uses its sonant in one variation or another.

To date, there are over 120 known varietals of coffee cherries; however, only Coffea Robusta and Coffea Arabica are commercially consumed, with the latter leading by 60 per cent of the global market. The unique flavours of the beans come not only from its ripeness, but also its harvesting, processing, roasting and brewing methods. A seemingly slight adjustment will vastly alter the profile of the beans and, ultimately, the cup of Joe you hold in your hands.

While the technicality of how flavour profiles are determined and distinguished requires months of studies, it is, for all intents and purposes, to say acidic levels and bitterness of a brew are the makers or breakers for most common brews. Some easy talking points to remember when talking about coffee to make even the most elementary of coffee drinkers sound sophisticated are:

Roasting

Short + High Temp = Acidic, Weak Flavours Short + Low Temp = Grassy, Weak Flavours Long + High Temp = Burnt, Dry Flavours

Long + Low Temp = Full, Bitter Flavours

Brewing

Fine Grains + Short Extraction = Highly Acidic Course Grains + Short Extraction = Diluted Fine Grains + Long Extraction = Astringent Bitterness Course Grains + Long Extraction = Astringent Dilution

Faithful to that formula, the type of roasted beans and brewing method a barista apply will widely depend on the type of Java being served. An Americano will require a different brew of espresso than a Flat White; likewise the beloved local Kopi O will vary from stall to stall depending on the uncle or auntie splitting the beans (solute) from the piping hot water (solvent). There is one exception to the roasting and brewing rule: franchises such as Starbucks. Their roasts and brewing methodologies are consistent worldwide, enabling the company to maintain its brand promise: "It has always been, and always will be, about quality." The uniqueness of this franchise model is with its locally-sourced dairy, which, depending on the country, will impact the flavours of any milk-based coffee.



An ode to tradition

Urbanisation is the bane to cultural preservation. With little fix up other than a tin awning serving as a roof, some metal pillars to hold up said roof, low-cost plastic chairs and tables in no particular integrated colour scheme whatsoever, is 四塊八發茶室 (directly translated to 4.80 Wealth Tea Shop), a well known hawker-style coffee shop lot among Serembanites in Taman Unian. Among the long stretch of vendors is Gerai Kopi Fatt, whose owner has been steeping local kopi for decades. Every cup ordered is done individually, with the filter cloth loosely fitted into a metal pot with a long spout, which creates pockets of air when poured into the half pint sized ceramic mug, often stained with coffees served from years gone.

Famous for its dark roasted, nutty flavour and slight acidic undertone, kopi served at Gerai Kopi Fatt differs from that of infamous Ipoh's style, which is more sweet and less nutty, but also full in body. The beans from Seremban has a meagre ghee essence and a saltiness that rounds out the sweetness from its roasting process. Whether served hot or iced, the kopi here retains its fullness and creamy texture through and through.

Kopi-ing in Malaysia

All good things come from the exchange of cultures, especially in regard to food and beverages, though the history of trade is less likened and leans into imperialism. As one would assume, coffee was introduced by the British settlement to Malaysia in the early 18th century. English officers thrived on the brew and since sharing is caring, 'kopi' was born. Due to the Malaysians unique blend of heritage and ethnicity, the roasting and brewing methods to create kopi differs from the western world. For one, coffee beans are dried and roasted in a large wok with butter and sugar over a convection oven; secondly, kopi isn't exactly brewed, it is tempered and filtered with a cloth.

There are four main types of kopis served in Malaysia: Kopi, which is poured with condensed milk; Kopi Si is infused with evaporated milk; Kopi-O is served with white sugar; and Kopi O Kau, which is both dense in flavour and extra strong. For those watching their sugar intake, Kopi Kosong (zero) means black coffee with no added enhancers.

Malaysians love their coffees. So much that, according to Statista, consuming over 670 thousand 60 kilograms bags of beans in 2017. The number climbed from 455 thousand to 625 thousand between 2011 to 2012, which is when the artisanal and gourmet coffee culture mushroomed across the two peninsulas. And in the quiet of Seremban townships, the culture similarly spread ubiquitously with coffee shops within a crossing of the road or around the corner from one another.

Sun kissed expression

Where: Hovin Coffee & Bakers

Sitting on the corner of an unassuming block in Pusat Perniagaan Senawang Jaya 2, this quaint little coffee shop with checkered floor tiles features miniature antique decors, including a British telephone booth in which will make for any Instagrammer's dream chill out. The interior is brightly lit with natural sunlight, thanks to its surround glass panels and undisturbed concrete exterior. Available are the usual combination of coffees and teas, but what sets this joint apart from the rest is their full Western menu, ranging from homemade patty burgers to scones from their own bakery.

Regaled for its coffee art, every variety cup has its own signature artwork served in the proper cup or glass designated for the brew. It's surprising not too many coffee aficionados are aware that cappuccino is to be served in a cup that differs from the flat white glass. As for lattes, it is only fitting for it to be poured into a double walled see through cup rather than a ceramic mug. Coffees here are perfectly tempered with minimal acidic after taste, which also means their roast is of high quality and their espresso machine is set to a sweet boiling temperature, ensuring that every drip is maximised with the right flavour, not skimming or compromising on the natural antioxidant properties in coffee.



Rustic with an edge

Where: The Coffeeholics

Hailing in first place on TripAdvisor for having the 'best coffee in town', The Coffeeholics is located in Seremban 2, possibly the most heavily densed concentration of cafes in all of Seremban. With an open kitchen concept, the warmly lit and spacious cafe serves up a modest menu of sandwiches, waffles, breakfast and salads. However, it's their coffees that steal the show.

Decorated with a mixture of soft, timbre and aluminium furnishing, The Coffeeholics is one of those spots you can just relax in, either enjoy reading in a quiet corner or catching up on work or meeting up with friends. Pockets of different table settings allow for their customers to transition between tasks seamlessly. Beyond their food and coffee offerings, the cafe also has a few merchandising counters, selling their beans of choice as well as artisan brewing mechanisms.

Ask for their special serving of espresso served in a double walled skull glass and be inspired to release your wild side.

Opened in 2015, Chars Cafe goes the extra mile to guarantee that coffee is the show stopper, encouraging you with their own unique blend of beans specially sourced from Vietnam and Indonesia. The cafe has two entrances, neither of which anyone would assume is nominally an exit. At one opening, a timbre bench sits closely next to a chalkboard depicting the kitchen's specials of the day; at the other entrance, a faux foliage area with a few seats are available for those who'd rather bask in the heat of Malaysian sun.

Decorated with hanging lanyard lights, the cafe itself is dimly lit, but perfect enough to cast silhouette of its brand onto the charcoal colored walls. For those unfamiliar with the different variations of coffee beans and their flavour profiles, Chars Cafe has installed a feature wall of description for either reading pleasure or information. The ordering counter is slightly elevated from the main floor, which provides customers with an eye level display of their cakes and desserts. Needless to say, their signature blend is by far the most sought-after cup of coffee — smooth in texture, packed with a bitter yet sweet aroma — one can say it's perfection in a mug.

One thing to note about Chars Cafe is its sound system and music choice in setup for the perfect atmosphere for an afternoon or evening date.



The Hanguk influence

If you're an affogato fan, do not hesitate to step into Bros. Cafe. Also located in Seremban 2, the double storey cafe is inspired by South Korean's coffee culture, with a dash of Italian. While affogato is technically classified as a dessert, it is infused with hot espresso before being doused and served with a heaping scoop full of ice cream, giving it a creaminess unlike that of other dairy pairing. It is a misconception that affogato is meant to be served frozen or cold; on the contrary, the espresso and ice cream tempers one another to create a lukewarm glass of melt-in-your-mouth euphoria.

Beautifully designed, the sophisticatedly modern yet humbly cosy joint bursts with natural sunlight and warm lighting fixtures. Bros. Cafe boasts an incredibly comprehensive menu, prepared in a fusion style with the freshest ingredients. If you've never tried Korean drip coffee before, this is a good place to start. While the wait time for food may be a bit longer than other surrounding cafes, it can be appreciated for its decadent layers of flavours.

A gem needless of discovery

Fun fact: Nearly 90 per cent of coffee beans used in local coffee shops in Malaysia are Liberica, an uncommon species of the flowering plant rarely used by the rest of the world. The bean itself is known to have a high acidic and robust profile which, when roasted, fare towards a smokey and nutty aftertaste. While the beans may not be consumed en masse globally, it is extremely beloved to Southeast Asians, with the three main producers being the Philippines, Indonesia and Malaysia. The beans are a valued commodity in Western countries, mainly due to its low production rate and scarce export.

Malaysians are accustomed to their roti bakar or roti stim kaya with two soft boiled eggs and either a cup of teh tarik or kopi, in an array of personal preferences. Local coffee shops may be commonplace and fill shop lots from corner to corner, but few stands for decades, serving one generation to the next. Restoran Melido is one of those gems in Seremban, located in a bustling lorong in Bandar Seremban, the shop is guarded with red Nescafe branded bamboo shades. Ageing uncles and aunties are often at the shop sharing stories and sipping on kopi while awaiting for their meal, offered by one of the many food stall vendors at the vintage joint.



THE ART OF AUTISM



The dictionary defines 'art' as the expression or application of human creative skill and imagination, typically in a visual form such as painting or sculpture, producing works to be appreciated primarily for their beauty or emotional power. Inspired by his son Owen Chong, contemporary Seremban artist Ben Chong shares his latest creations. The Autism Series.

Q: Can you elaborate on why the topic of autism is close to your heart, leading up to this instalment?

A: All my inspiration comes from my son Owen. He has mild autism, but he is special, amazing, compassionate and caring. He doesn't understand where he fits in socially and don't converse much, but he is like all of us. He may not be set in his mind, but he is in his heart. Owen learned to paint about five years ago, guided by a French teacher. Last year, he was invited by the Unesco of Paris to showcase his artwork. I was so proud and from that day onwards, I decided to start my Autism Series in order to show people the world of autism.

Q: How does art communicate differently with the autistic community?

A: We are always trying to find the perfect person, but only by learning to see an imperfect person perfectly do we really communicate. Life favours those who see things differently. I think of my son whenever I start waiting and sometimes I would take time to observe his behaviour and speech that sparks an idea. Autistic kids are so unique. They get to experience the world in a very different way. They can see the wind, hear the bees singing in the park and feel incredible emotions flowing from the people who care for them. Most people don't understand them, but they have feelings, they think and have emotions, they just express them differently.







Q: How has this series changed your outlook in life?

A: I used to paint to please people, but now I paint because I enjoy it. I learned that life is not only about me, but inclusive of all the people around me. That is how you source your life to be better and different. It's amazing how much art pieces have influenced the parents of autistic children. In 2017, I sold about 80 per cent of my Autism Series, aimed at inspiring compassion and empathy within the community. I hope that through my paintings, viewers both affected and not touched by autism can gain a keen sense of awareness, acceptance, compassion and love.

Q: What is your favourite piece in this instalment and why?

A: 'Selfharm' is my favourite, inspired by my son's classmate. It was the first piece of my Autism Series. One day, I saw my son's classmate wearing a helmet to class and out of curiosity, asked the teacher why. He said that is because the child felt frustrated and unhappy, which causes him to bang his head against the wall. The helmet is to protect him from self-inflicted harm. And only when you know, it stops becoming silly.



About Ben Chong

After graduating from the Malaysia Institute of Art, Ben Chong established himself in the advertising, interior design, design and fine arts industries. Since he started painting, he has participated in numerous group exhibition across Asia as well as realising his own solo exhibition. Chong finds inspiration through human nature, especially in recent years, focusing on human figures, structures and portraits. For Chong, he finds art, music and architecture to work in symmetry, saying "the goal is to make [art] become a part of your daily life, surpassing artificial boundaries of culture, art and custom." Chong had his first overseas exhibition in Seoul, South Korea in 2017. Known mainly for his great expressive force in strokes and seemingly uncontrolled brushstrokes, Chong tells a very comprehensive story without specifying on details.

I can still remember my first day here. Having grown up in a Chinese-speaking environment, I experienced culture shock when I discovered that most of the people here are English native speakers who can't speak in Chinese, especially the teachers. It took me a period of time to adapt to this wholly new environment, especially to understand the different slangs of the teachers." Ho Min Xuan is the school's highest IGCSE achiever to date, having attained 11 A* grades and currently continuing her A level studies at Kolej Yayasan UEM in Lembah Beringin.

The private section of the school, Matrix Private School (MPS), follows the Malaysian National Curriculum; Kurikulum Standard Sekolah Rendah (KSSR) for Primary level and Kurikulum Standard Sekolah Menengah (KSSM) for Secondary while adopting the Dual Language Programme (DLP). Cambridge curriculum components for English, Maths and Science subjects are added to enhance students' learning experience, giving those interested the option to sit for Cambridge Secondary Checkpoint or the IGCSE papers for English and Maths.

In the 2018 Ujian Penilaian Sekolah Rendah (UPSR) results, the school once again maintained a 99% overall passing percentage with an improved school average grade (GPS) of 2.1. The grade system is commonly used to track the overall grade achievement of all candidates sitting for a particular exam, whereby a lower GPS number signifies a better achievement.

As for the Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM) examinations, in 2017 Matrix Private School secured a 97% pass rate with a GPS of 3.82 and three outstanding students achieving straight 9 As.

SAY IT WITH A LOVE LETTER




Synonymous with Chinese New Year, the semprong wafers, or otherwise known as Kuih Kapit (love letters), is both a taste of nostalgia and adaptation.

It's the eve of Lunar New Year. Tins of sugary, crispy treasures have been packed and sealed, placed on the dining room table, awaiting for guests' arrival the following day. Every kid knows to go for what's inside the tin, because surely, a generations-old recipe wafers are either rolled neatly standing side by side, or a flat surfaced triangle sleeps stacked atop one another. The beloved Kuih Kapit is a simple yet delightful snack, most commonly found during festive seasons, especially during Chinese New Year. The idea of an egg roll wafer is believed to have been introduced to Southeast Asia by the Dutch, improving much on the recipe by the Chinese to what we love and enjoy today as 'love letters'.

While many flavours such as peanut butter, pandan, chocolate and sesame seeds have spruced up in recent years, the original, plain kuih kapit remains the most beloved and top selling for vendors. Of course, there's always the option to purchase already made love letters from suppliers, but something so easily made with a simple tool and batter can serve to build new traditions in the kitchen with family members during the celebration.

Seeking moulds

Moulds come in a variety of patterns, giving love letters the distinct bevels in its design. The traditional iron clapper moulds can be found with a simple Google search, however, if you're working with a modern kitchen, it's best to skip the classic tool as they were designed to work with open flame. Opt instead for an egg roll maker which claps down like a waffle machine, making clean up and life in general that much easier.





Original Kuih Kapit Yields: 80 wafers

Ingredients (yield 50 tarts)

250g Rice Flour
50g Tapioca Flour
300 Caster Sugar
400ml Virgin Coconut Milk
1tsp Salt
10 Large Eggs
1tbsp Vegetable Oil

Method

in a mixing bowl, add eggs, caster sugar and salt, beat until sugar is dissolved. Add virgin coconut milk and fold into wet mixture, about 30 seconds. Add rice flour and tapioca flour to the batter and mix until smooth, making sure to scrap down the sides so the batter is well incorporated.

Strain the batter through a fine sieve to remove any lump. Heat the mould until hot. Lightly oil the mould and ladle a small dollop of batter thinly onto one side of the mould. Clasp close and grill until golden brown. While it is still hot, roll it with the thick end of a chopstick for egg roll style or fold over twice for a rounded triangle, which resembles more of an actual letter.

Leave to cool until room temperature before storing.

One of the hallmarks of a company with good Investor Relations practices is management's assurance of continuity and sustainability, be it in business model or leadership changes in the company.

Undertaking standard procedures as per an existing system would provide assurance to business associates and customers of the relationship's continuity, and give the impression of potential business going forward even under the new leadership.

At the same time, the new leader must also understand the importance of forging a new way forward, by adapting the business model, company practices or products to the evolving environment and/or buyer preferences. After all, it is likely the continuous innovation that enabled the company to create a track record in the first place, and hence improvements and enhancements should continue.



2) Choose the next leader wisely

Any succession planning programme is often followed by the debate on whether an organisation should promote internally or hire from external sources.

Regardless, the new person-in-charge should possess the required technical and sector expertise, enjoy the rapport of the both internal and external stakeholders, have a wide business network, and develop ideas for sustained business relevancy in a changing landscape.
